



TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE UPGRADING OF THE LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION SYSTEM (LMIS)

PROJECT OVERVIEW AND ROLE

The Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Labour (MCIL) in collaboration with support from the International Labour Organization (ILO) will conduct the upgrading and reviewing of the current Labour Market Information System 2016 (LMIS).

The objective of the consultancy assignment is to support (1) the upgrading of the current Labour Market Information System to a user-friendly online platform (2) the review of existing mechanisms for the administration and facilitation of employment services (3) capacity building for ELM staff for LMIS implementation, under the overall guidance of the Assistant CEO Apprenticeship, Employment and Labour Market (AELM) and in close cooperation with ACEO, Corporate Services Unit and Principal Information Technology Officer of MCIL and in collaboration with ILO.

The 2021 Labour Market Information System (LMIS) will assist MCIL to have an effective and efficient On-line labour market system for better networking and dispatchment of Labour Market Information (LMI) to stakeholders and the public at the stipulated timeframe. The provision and the availability of LMI using this upgraded online system will assist decision makers at the national level re; demands and supply in the labour market to improve Samoa's economy.

The consultant will work closely with ACEO AELM & ACEO CSU and Principal Information Technology of the Corporate Services Unit, and ILO Project Co-ordinator in Samoa.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

The Deliverables of the consultancy are expected to contribute to the following outcomes at the national level:

- Supporting the review and upgrading of the current LMIS and the development of the 2021 Labour Market Information System will assist MCIL and key stakeholders to fully utilize and implement the 2021 LMIS. MCIL will have an effective LMIS to advance productive employment information and statistics for all in the formal sector in terms of gender, age, qualification, wages and salaries, specialized skills and knowledge as well as other labour market aspects.
- Ensuring the commitments of key stakeholders, LMI users, employers, jobseekers, training providers and the public for fully utilization of 2021 LMIS.
