PROJECT OVERVIEW AND ROLE

The objective of this consultancy assignment is to improve the knowledge and skills of DBS and SBH staff when assisting Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) to restructure their overall business, finances and credit lines in the COVID-19 environment. The consultants will also assist 20 MSME to restructure their credit lines; obtain new loans; or take other concrete actions that will have a positive impact on their viability.

The Lead Consultant for the assignment has been procured. They are based overseas; and due to the COVID-19 pandemic and state of emergency restrictions they can only provide technical assistance via online platforms. Hence, the local consultant is procured to bridge the gap between the international consultant and the agencies requesting the technical assistance (i.e. DBS and SBH).
